STUDYING THE QURAN - AS ORDINARY PEOPLE

STAGE 1 = FAMILIARISE

- 1. Set intention and engage the inner self.
- 2. Read the passage until the words soak in and you have a broad overview.
- 3. Note down major themes.
- 4. Note the central theme if there is one.
- 5. Divide the passage into chunks based on message.
- 6. Highlight key words or phrases linked to understanding.
- 7. Note down questions.

STAGE 3 = CONSOLIDATE

Preserve the understanding you have arrived at - note it down! Don't take any understanding as complete, as it may shift and change over time and learning.

STAGE 2 = STUDY

- 1. What do the important words mean?
- 2. Meaning of phrases or statements.
- 3. Find links between them think about the order.
- 4. Find meaning in the context of: passage, surah, Quran.
- 5. What are the key messages and lessons?
- 6. Why is this for me, now?
- 7. What does this mean for mankind as a whole?



- Find meaning in the context of: passage, surah, Quran.
- Note down major themes.
- Divide the passage into chunks based on message.
- Highlight key words or phrases linked to understanding.
- Note down questions.

- An answer to the Qura'ysh (Makki)
- After Surah Lahab
- Towards end of Quran
- Equivalent to 1/3 of the Quran
- Beloved by the Prophet (PBUH).
